

Head Lice 101

Transmission

- Lice do not hop, swim or jump; they can only crawl
- Pets do not play a role in the transmission of lice
- Without a human host a louse can not survive 48 hours
- In most cases, transmission occurs by direct contact. Indirect spread through combs, brushes, hats, helmets is much less likely to occur.
- To control 1) reduce the number of lice on the head and 2)lessen the risks of head-to-head contact

Prevention

- Check your child's hair weekly. Long hair should be kept up in a ponytail bun/braid during school/after school activities
- Use preventative products: the best is to use a leave-in conditioner that can also be sprayed on backpacks, jackets, etc.
- If you are positive inform friends/family around you and ask them to do the same.
- After sleepover or overnight stay comb through your child's hair with nit comb and conditioner
- Have your school/camp set up routine school lice screening service to prevent it from spreading

Home Cleaning

- Wash all bedding in hot water and dry on the hottest setting for 30 mins
- Vacuum all surfaces. Carpets, flooring, couches, car seats etc.
- Stuffed animals and blankets can be washed and dried on high heat or placed in sealed bag for 3 to 7 days.
- Dry recently worn clothing such as hats, jackets and tops on hottest setting or place in sealed bag for 48 hours.
- Combs and brushes should be replaced or soaked in hot water (very hot/). Hair ties, headbands, etc. should also be washed or bagged for 48 hours

Treatment Options

- There are many over-the-counter brands (OTC). They are not 100% effective
 - Rid, Triple X or Nix, Fairy Tales etc. (follow the guidelines on the packaging)
- Natural Oils: tea tree, rosemary, lavender, cinnamon leaf, read thyme etc. Without thorough combing natural oils do not get rid off lice
- DIY: combing out hair at home with conditioner.

Life Cycle Of Head Lice

- The head louse is **2 to 3 mm long** (the size of a sesame seed)
- The eggs typically hatch in 8 to 9 days.
- A nymph becomes an adult in the next 7 to 9 days
- Adult louse lives up to approx. **30 days** and can lay up to **10+ eggs per day.**
- If not treated, the cycle repeats itself approx. every 3 weeks.
- Eggs are firmly attached to the base of the hair -within approximately 4 mm of the scalp with a gluelike substance produced by the louse
- Eggs camouflage with pigment to match the hair color
- Empty egg casings are white against darker hair
